PRIMARY OBJECTIVE

The role will be responsible for the efficient planning, directing and management of all aspects of maintenance for community housing assets. This relates to both daily, preventative maintenance, repairs to property and management of third-party contractors. This position has high expectations around effective communication and appropriate documentation. To ensure community properties have 7-day maintenance coverage this role will be required to be on call where required on weekends.

- Provide high-level reporting to DIPL every month to ensure Council meet or exceed monthly budget targets, ensure appropriate spending to maintain housing to agreed standards including regular visits to community housing assets
- Liaise and engage with tenants, residents, stakeholders, and DIPL on a regular basis
- Encourage and provide on-the-job training for local staff
- Meet property inspection requirements & maintenance timelines in accordance with the NT Tenancy Management framework
- Work closely with client(s) and team to deliver operational benchmarks to ensure that all activity levels requirements and performance indicators are met
- Follow up with client(s) and staff issues as they arise within the delivery of the contract services
- Lead and mentor a culturally diverse team
