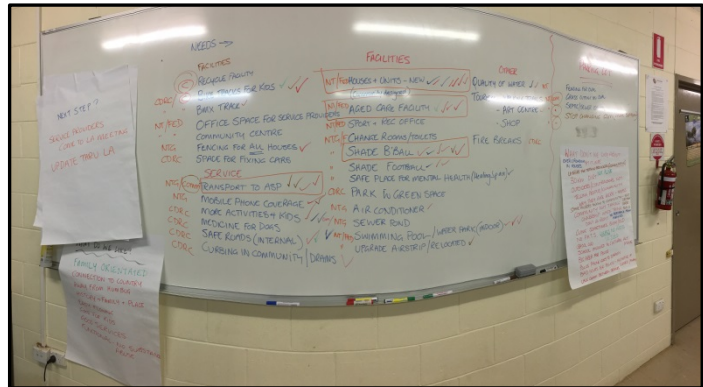

Atitjere is located 215 km from Alice Springs along the Plenty Highway. Nestled at the base of the Harts Ranges, Atitjere is home to some 224 people. The following services are provided to the residents of Atitjere: school and crèche, aged care service, Police station, health clinic, Central Land Council office, shop with fuel and takeaway food and a Regional Council office.



## RECENT COMMUNITY ACHIEVEMENTS

- ✓ Kerbing and traffic management project improving the safety for residents and visitors
- ✓ Irrelirre's solar power system substantially upgraded to provide more power to residents
