Willowra is located on the edge of the Tanami Desert 300 km north of Alice Springs. The community has a school, a Learning Centre, a store, a playgroup, an aged care facility, an airstrip, a community safety patrol, both Centrlink and Post Office agencies and an unmanned police station. The people of Willowra speak Warlpiri as their first language, although it's not uncommon for people to speak four or five languages.

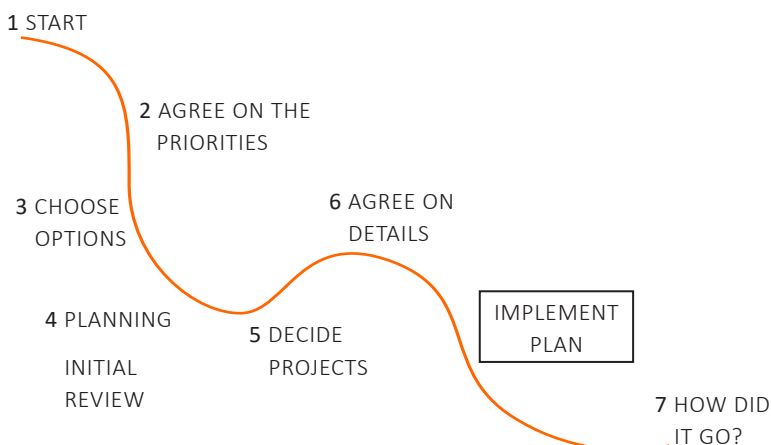
